MUNDELEIN ORGAN

The magnificent 4-manual, 21-rank Howell-Wurlitzer began life as a 14-rank theatre organ installed by Pete Howell in the Al Carney radio studio in Chicago. When Jesse and Helen Crawford left the Chicago Theatre for New York, their second console became available and was added to the Carney theatre organ. The Geneva Organ Company supplied a relay to control the console and the unit chests. After the death of Al Carney, Cardinal Mundelein requested the acquisition of the organ for the seminary. In 1934, the Kilgen Organ Company installed the organ in the auditorium making some additions as part of the installation.

The Chicago Area Theatre Organ Enthusiasts (CATOE) took over maintaining the organ in 1973 after the departure of the long-time curator John Seng. In February of 2011, CATOE began the restoration of the console as it was beginning to show signs of severe fatigue (the last major rebuild of the console occurred in 1960). The leather for the combination action had started to rot, a family of mice helped themselves to a few pneumatics, and the bench was cracked and falling apart. The decision was made to restore the console and replace the main wiring from the console to the relay at the same time. There are about 200 feet of over 800 wires running between console and the relay, with over 5,800 connection points. Four hundred and two newly made and leathered Wurlitzer-copy pneumatics and a solid-state coupler system with 99-memory combination action were installed.

In an effort to restore the console's appearance to its 1921 splendor, several reproduction Wurlitzer parts were used, including Wurlitzer copy piano pedals, swell shoes, ebony-capped pedal sharps, and brass nameplates. A new Wurlitzer replica bench was also made for the console for its debut in October of 2014.

The organ is maintained for the seminary by CATOE. This summer, July 2-7, CATOE will present the Mundelein organ in concert during the 65th Annual American Theater Organ Society (ATOS) visit. For more information, visit www.catoe.org.

ACADEMIC COSTUME

All degrees are awarded by the
 University of Saint Mary of the Lake/Mundelein Seminary.

The history of academic dress reaches back to the 13th century. To avoid "excess apparel," academic gowns were prescribed. It is believed that the gown was also worn for warmth. Whether the origin of academic dress is ecclesiastical or civilian has never been settled. The code of academic dress in the United States was adopted in 1900.

There are four different gowns, two undergraduate and two graduate.

- The associate gown is worn closed and has a small round-ed sleeve. It may be black or grey.
- The bachelor gown is black with a pointed, bell sleeve and is designed to be worn closed.
- The master gown is worn for all graduate degrees below the doctorate. It is always black and has a unique oblong sleeve that is open at the wrist.
- The doctoral gown is much fuller and has bell shaped sleeves. The doctoral gown is trimmed with panels of velvet and three chevrons on each sleeve. The velvet may be black or of a color indicating the discipline of the degree. It is designed to be worn either open or closed.

Hoods are ceremoniously placed over the candidate's head during the conferral of their degree. The coloring and size usually represent the type and subject of degree earned, and sometimes the institution from which it was awarded.

- Graduates in Theology wear hoods trimmed in scarlet.
- The length of the hood worn for the bachelor's degree must be three feet, for the master's degree three and one-half feet, and for the doctoral degree, four feet.



HISTORY

1844: Saint Mary's College was founded by the Right Reverend William J. Quarter, the first bishop of Chicago. Receiving the first university charter from the State of Illinois, the college was empowered to confer degrees under the name *University of Saint Mary of the Lake*. Originally located at Madison Street and Wabash Avenue in Chicago, it soon moved to State and Superior, the site now occupied by Holy Name Cathedral.

1867: Financial difficulties caused the University to suspend operations.

1921: Archbishop Mundelein re-opened Saint Mary of the Lake Seminary with schools of philosophy and theology. The dedication took place on May 25, 1924.

1929: Cardinal Mundelein obtained a grant from the Sacred Congregation of Seminaries and Universities in Rome for the theological faculty to confer the international degrees of the Catholic Church – the baccalaureate, the licentiate, and the doctorate in theology. This was the first American institution honored as a Pontifical Theological Faculty.

1971: Affiliated with the Association of Theological Schools.

1986: The *University of Saint Mary of the Lake* honored its second founder by renaming the seminary graduate school as *Mundelein Seminary*, making it the center for all basic formation for ministry.

2000: Francis Cardinal George continued the development of the University by transferring the Archdiocese of Chicago's ministry programs – (i) Diaconate Formation, (ii) the Institute for Pastoral Leadership, and (iii) the Instituto de Liderazgo Pastoral – to the University grounds, and by creating the Liturgical Institute.

2023: With the reorganization of the institutes at USML into a new School of Parish Leadership and Evangelization. The organizational change positions the school to grow and to meet the increasingly challenging needs of parishes throughout the Archdiocese of Chicago and the Church of the United States.

Bachillerato en Teología Sagrada

El programa de bachillerato introduce a sus estudiantes en las diferentes ramas de la teología católica. Este programa de estudios es paralelamente cercano al que se ofrece en la Maestría en Divinidad del Mundelein Seminary, con algunos requerimientos adicionales y un examen de comprensión. El programa normalmente se realiza en un periodo de tres años de estudios.

Maestría en Divinidad

La Maestría de Divinidad está diseñada como un programa de cuatro años, teórico-prácticos de estudios académicos. Luego de ingresar el alumno en la Escuela de Teología, pasa once trimestres tomando cursos en el campus universitario, un semestre trabajando en un internado pastoral fuera del campus universitario, y un verano (después del tercer año) en un programa de Educación Clínica Pastoral (C.P.E.) u otro programa de internado aprobado.

Licenciatura en Teología Sagrada

En 1929, la Facultad de Teología del Mundelein Seminary recibió permiso de la Sagrada Congregación de Seminarios y Universidades para otorgar títulos eclesiásticos. Esta autorización de otorgar el Bachillerato, Licenciatura y Doctorado en Teología Sagrada se hizo permanente en 1934. Estos títulos en Teología Sagrada requieren de pericia en Teología académica y demostrar habilidad en estudios de investigación. Guiados por las normas de la Sagrada Congregación para la Educación Católica, la Licenciatura en Teología Sagrada en Mundelein Seminary incluye una especialización en teología Trinitaria, Cristología o Antropología Cristiana.



Mundelein Seminary / Seminario de Mundelein

El Seminario de Mundelein tiene sus comienzos desde el Colegio de St. Mary, fundado en 1844 por el Obispo Quarter, en Chicago. Ese mismo año, el colegio recibió la carta del Estado de Illinois y se le concedió el poder de otorgar títulos bajo el nuevo nombre de University of St. Mary of the Lake. Cuando el arzobispo Mundelein estableció este seminario mayor en 1921 en la presente localidad, lo hizo bajo la carta original otorgada a la University of St. Mary of the Lake/Mundelein Seminary, miembro de la Asociación de las Escuelas de Teología, prepara candidatos para el sacerdocio diocesano de la Arquidiócesis de Chicago y de otras treinta y tres diócesis.

Programa de Formación Ministerial para Laicos

University of St. Mary of the Lake/Mundelein Seminary, patrocina dos programas de formación para laicos: el Programa de Formación para Laicos en español y en inglés. La formación ofrecida por estos programas está dirigida tanto para aquellas personas que hacen voluntariado en sus parroquias como para los que han decidido servir a tiempo completo en el ministerio parroquial. Ambos programas, cuya duración es de dos años, ofrecen un certificado de estudios. Actualmente hay más de 1,500 personas graduadas sirviendo en las parroquias de la Arquidiócesis. *Together in God's Service* es un programa de formación en inglés creado para dar una mayor atención y apoyo a la vocación del Ministerio Eclesial de Laicos en la Arquidiócesis de Chicago. Hombres y mujeres que desean obtener estudios reconocidos por la Iglesia para servir más tarde como Asociados Pastorales o Coordinadores de Educación Religiosa.

Programa de Formación para el Diaconado Permanente

El Programa de Formación para el Diaconado Permanente provee un proceso de discernimiento y preparación teológica pastoral a varones que sientan el llamado a ser diáconos permanentes en la Arquidiócesis de Chicago. El programa de formación para el Diaconado en español se desarrolla en un período mínimo de cuatro años, después de haber completado los dos años del programa de formación para el ministerio laico. El programa en inglés consiste en cuatro años de discernimiento vocacional y formación. El currículo y la práctica pastoral están diseñados para fomentar el crecimiento humano, espiritual, intelectual y pastoral de los aspirantes y candidatos. Aproximadamente el noventa por ciento de los candidatos son casados. Las esposas que participan activamente en el programa con

This service is carried under the guidance of the bishop, in collaboration with pastors and their associates. The seminarians prepared in this program have as their main focus the parochial ministry. The theological education is comprehensive and extensive. It gives witness to the unity of the faith, according to the tradition of the Church and the Magisterium, and to the authentic diversity of theological expression; it is pastorally oriented, ecumenically sensitive, and relevant for the multi-cultural realities of the Catholic Church in the United States. Education in the M.Div. program is a dynamic process in which students personally appropriate what is taught and bring it into dialogue with the people and setting of their parish ministry.

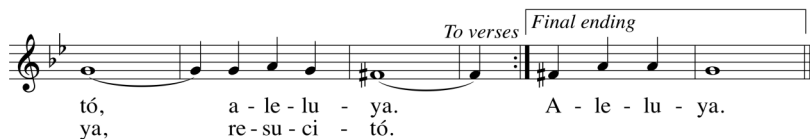
